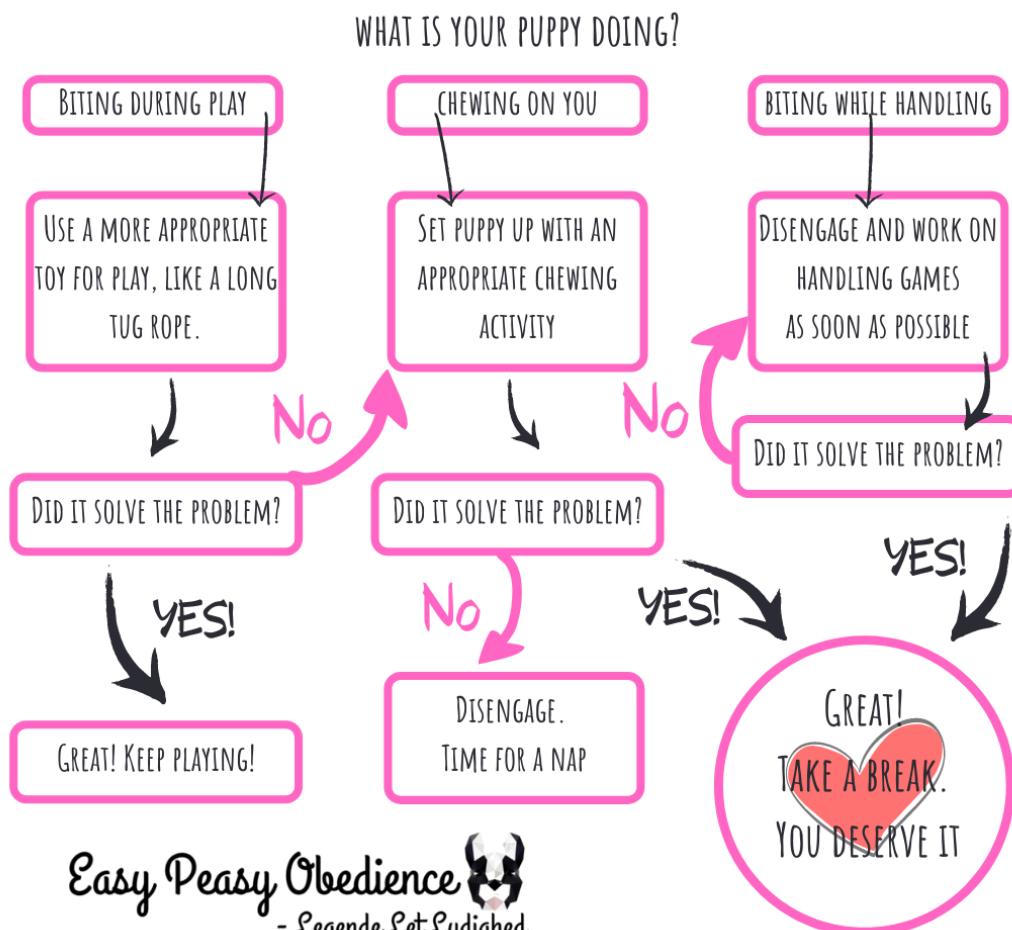
Don't encourage biting on you. If you play with your puppy, play with toys, not your hands, feet, and other body parts.
